Dear Partner / Stakeholder,

I wanted to update you on the work we've been doing to strengthen our neighbourhood policing model and confirm the outcome of the recent review of PCSO duties and shift patterns.

This review allows us to realign duties and modernise the role so it works even more effectively alongside the uplift of 53 officers in neighbourhood policing. This also aligns to our promise in the Policing Plan and the Neighbourhood Policing Guarantee around visibility within communities.

Over the past few months we've taken a detailed look at how PCSOs spend their time, where demand is changing and how we can make sure the service we provide in local communities continues to be visible, consistent and focussed on the issues that matter the most.

PCSOs have been a core part of local policing for over two decades and the role hasn't been updated at the same pace as crime and demand has evolved.

As part of this, two new shift patterns will come into effect in the summer of 2026 for our PCSOs. With some PCSOs finishing at 7pm while others finish at 9pm. This supports visibility in the early evenings, gives better coverage across the week and ensures we are there for issues around town centre crime and anti-social behaviour.

No PCSOs hours are being reduced and our operational policing remains a 24/7 service.

Alongside this change, some duties such as supporting statement taking for offences like shoplifting will be strengthened to help speed up investigations and improve the service to victims of crime. This will not take PCSOs away from communities, it ensures they contribute where they can make the most difference. Their core focus on engagement, problem-solving and building trust is unchanged.

I would also like to reassure you that this sits within our neighbourhood policing guarantee and reflects the investment we've made in local policing. We've increased our police officer numbers by 53 we are undertaking problem-solving activity and the continued focus on hot-spot locations continues. We know how vital these partnerships are in preventing crime is and tackling the problems residents and you tell us matter most.

PCSOs have been closely involved in the process and we are supporting them through individual one
